SUBJECT: STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

### STATEMENT:

The Seabird Community School Education Committee believes that a Code of Conduct should:

- 1. Help create an atmosphere in which the school is able to fulfill its duty to provide educational services to students.
- 2. Help create an atmosphere in which each student may take advantage of those educational services and carry out such learning activities as may be required;
- 3. Foster the development in each student of a sense of responsibility for one's own actions; and
- 4. Help create an atmosphere of trust and security in which students may grow confidence as a result of their achievements.

The Seabird Island Education Society further believes that the initial training and discipline of the child begins at home. The parents must ensure that child/ren come to school with the attitude of respect for all people and all things.

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### SUBJECT: STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

### 1.0 General

- 1.1 The Principal shall establish a written set of rules to govern the conduct of students attending the school.
- 1.2 This set of rules shall be consistent with the school's statement of philosophy.
- 1.3 This set of rules shall be consistent with the Effective Behaviour Support (EBS) philosophy; Be Kind; Be Safe; Be Cooperative; and Be Respectful. The Effective Behaviour Support Matrix outlines the expectations of the students in the following areas:

- 1.4 The EBS matrix shall be consistent with Seabird Island Community School's polices, and the Independent School Act and Regulations.
- 1.5 A copy of EBS matrix shall be filed with the Education Manager upon formulation and after each revision.
- 1.6 The EBS matrix shall be communicated to the students and parents annually.
