

Housing Renovation Opportunity 2022

Cheam FN Housing department is intending to apply for renovation projects this year again through Indigenous Service Canada (ISC) Housing Support Program (HSP). There are three categories that I will be applying for 1) Regular Renovations and 2) Health and Safety Renovations and 3) Energy Efficiency Renovations (new)

From the past 13 units that are almost completed I discovered a lot of the homes required the Health and Safety Renovations. This will mean 2 inspections, one with a Health inspector and another with a Building inspector who will go through each unit to compile a work scope for your home to submit with the application.

Please note that homes that are in Phase 9 and 10 will be ineligible for this funding.

I am looking to see if any members living on Cheam FN who own their homes are interested in seeing if they are eligible.

Criteria:

- 1) There have been no ISC renovations in the last 10 years
- 2) Items of concern are not cosmetic (must be one or more of roof, gutters, soffits, siding, fascia, foundation, plumbing, heating, deck/stairs, health/safety, electrical)
- 3) One or more inspections may be required, by staff and external inspectors

Funding available is up to \$42K (including inspection cost) so it is limited; if cost of renovations is over the funded amount, the homeowner would be expected to cover the difference.

Please contact Lydia Archie, Housing Manager if you are interested as I am booking the inspectors second week in September 2022.

HSP Facts:

- 1. New Home Construction and Renovations (including Health and Safety and regular renovations) up to double the current subsidy rate (NEW!). Rates will revert to current subsidy levels April 1, 2025.
- 2. NEW! Energy Efficiency Renovations in addition to other renovations, First Nations can apply for renovations that support energy efficiency upgrades, such as exchanging single-paned windows, heat pumps, weather stripping, etc.



FREE SOMATIC TRAUMA THERAPY FOR CHEAM MEMBERS

Story is important, but for Somatic Trauma Therapy, we focus on the body and its own way of telling that story.

The goal of somatic trauma therapy is to drain some of the weight of the past in a safe way. Somatic trauma therapy will be run in groups of 4 people, meeting weekly, for 12 weeks. Consider how committing to this program would affect other parts of life. Intake is ongoing.

In small groups we learn to focus on the experience of the body using:



- * Body focused grounding tools
- * Present moment awareness
- * Some learning about how emotions help with somatic therapy
- * The last portion of the meeting is somatic trauma therapy. People are guided through the process of giving control of their body over to their body. There is often some shaking, or crying, or other involuntary movement or sounds. This is part of the body's instinctive process of resolving being traumatized.

We aim to keep it as safe, and gentle as needed.
