DOES THE FNHA SECURITY BREACH EFFECT YOU?

What happened, and when did this happen?

During the week of May 13, 2024, FNHA responded to an incident in which an unauthorized entity (the attacker) gained access to certain FNHA information technology systems. FNHA detected and immediately responded to this incident while it was occurring, but the attackers were able to access, copy and steal files from one portion of the FNHA network.

SIGN UP FOR ELECTRONIC FUNDS TRANSFER (EFT)

NETTLE PESTO RECIPE

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 small bag (about 6 cups)
 Young fresh bag of nettles, rinsed
- 1 bunch (about 2 cups leaves) Basil, stems removed, washed, and drained
- 1/2 cup Parmesan or Romano cheese, grated
- 1/3 cup Walnuts or Pine Nuts
- 1/3 cup Extra virgin olive oil
- 1-3 cloves Garlic, chopped
- 1 tsp Lemon juice
- to taste Salt and pepper







INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Add your nettle and basil to your food processor or blender, along with your walnuts and garlic. Mix.
- 2. Add your lemon, cheese and oil and mix again until blended.

The Claims Period for the Removed Child Class and their eligible Caregiving Parents or Caregiving Grandparents opens on March 10, 2025

Are you a First Nations individual who was removed from your home as a Child, on Reserve or in the Yukon, between April 1, 1991, and March 31, 2022, and placed into care funded by Indigenous Services Canada? Or are you the Caregiving Parents or Caregiving Grandparents of a Removed Child?

If so, you may be eligible for compensation under this Settlement.

Compensation is not yet available, but you can get ready to submit your Claim by ensuring you have:



government-issued identification



a mailina address



a bank account in your name for compensation deposit

- The day of March 17 (time range tbd, but assuming it would be a full day) You must be able to hike off-trail






